# WREN Program Co-Director University of Wisconsin-Madison

Official Title: RESEARCHER(E05DN) or ASSOC RESEARCHER(E05FN)

Degree and area of specialization: MS in biological or health sciences or the equivalent experience and/or knowledge required, PhD preferred. Requires experience in research, project and grant development and implementation, relationship development including patient and other stakeholder engagement, and management of a primary care practice based research network.

#### License/certification:

- Incumbent must obtain and maintain a state of Wisconsin driver's license in order to be covered by state liability insurance for travel.
- Minimum number of years and type of relevant work experience:
- A minimum 3 years of experience in managing projects required.
- A minimum of 3 or more years of leadership in a primary care, practice based research network (PBRN) preferred.
- A history of co-authoring, development, and submission of grants required.
- Ability to work in collaboration with multiple partners (e.g. patients, health professionals, health care systems) on complex

#### Principal duties:

#### Research Project Development & Implementation (55%)

- Strategic planning, including furthering the existing WREN research agenda, identifying other opportunities for university, state, regional, private and national funding and opportunities for collaboration on research and quality improvement projects to inform primary health care.
- Consult on, write and edit grant proposals and manuscripts.
- Develop Co-Director's research agenda: submit grants, acquire funding, and publish results
- Collaborate with external PIs on joint projects.
- Assist the WREN Medical Director with recruitment of health care systems, primary care clinics, physicians, and staff for research and QI project participation.

#### RELATIONSHIP DEVELOPMENT/OUTREACH (40%)

- Actively seek out investigators and collaborators on and off-campus to carry forward the WREN research agenda.
- Promote the interests of WREN members, DFMCH clinicians and investigators, WREN meta-network collaborators and other WREN affiliates to the broader research community.
- In collaboration with the WREN Medical Director, manage relationships and communications with the WREN steering
  committee, the Department of Family Medicine and Community Health (DFMCH), and with external constituents and
  granting agencies; represent the DFMCH on campus and medical school committees related to the work of the Institute for
  Clinical and Translational Research as well as at regional and national meetings.

#### WREN PBRN PROGRAM MANAGEMENT (5%)

- Collaborate with the DFMCH Research Program Manager to hire WREN staff to ensure objectives, goals, and outcomes are attained for WREN external and internal projects.
- Facilitate communication with regional WREN staff to coordinate statewide activities and projects. Provide coaching and assist in the evaluation of WREN staff.
- Work with the DFMCH Research Program Manager to ensure project time lines and WREN priorities are being met. Provide oversight of WREN staff development of presentations at regional and national meetings.
- Work closely with the DFMCH Research Program Manager to develop the WREN yearly operating budget, which currently consists of multiple funded projects totaling approximately \$725,000 annually.

#### **Additional Information**

The ideal candidate will also have experience:

- Facilitating IRB approvals.
- Developing and presenting research findings at meetings and conferences.
- Authoring and co-authoring publications in peer reviewed journals.
- Some travel within the state of Wisconsin will be required. Mileage traveled will be reimbursed through project resources at the current state level. Some evening and weekend work may be required.
