### Dedra Buchwald, MD

Dr. Buchwald is a Professor of Epidemiology in the School of Public Health and a Professor of Medicine at the University of Washington. Additionally, she leads the Initiative for Research and Education to Advance Community Health (IREACH) at Washington State University, a large, integrated effort to improve the health of rural and minority people. Dr. Buchwald is the founding director of the Partnerships for Native Health, which encompasses research, education, training, advocacy, and technical activities nationwide with over 160 partners.

### **Dayna Bowen Matthews**

Dayna Matthew is a leader in public health who focuses on racial disparities in healthcare, and a member of the University of Virginia law faculty and is the author of the book "Just Medicine: A Cure for Racial Inequality in American Health Care." In 2013, Ms. Matthew worked with a law firm partner to found the Colorado Health Equity Project, a medical-legal partnership incubator aimed at removing barriers to good health for low-income clients by providing legal representation, research, and policy advocacy.





### Donna Manca, MD, MCISc, FCFP

Dr. Manca is a clinician researcher and a practicing family physician in Edmonton, Alberta, Canada. She the Director of Research in the Department of Family Medicine at the University of Alberta. She is also the Director of the Northern Alberta Primary Care Research Network (NAPCReN), a network contributing data to the Canadian Primary Care Research Network. She was a Co-Principal Investigator of the BETTER trial (Building on Existing Tools to Improve Chronic Disease Prevention and Screening in Primary Care) and a Principal Investigator of the BETTER Program and BETTER WISE project.

### Head, General Practice & Chair Department of General Practice, Melbourne Medical School, The University of Melbourne, Australia

The Chair of General Practice is expected to make innovative and distinctive contributions to the academic discipline of General Practice within the Melbourne Medical School.
