University of Iowa - Carver College of Medicine Chair, Department of Family Medicine

The Carver College of Medicine at The University of Iowa seeks candidates for the position of Chair, Department of Family Medicine. The Carver College of Medicine is a part of a major research university and is ranked 13th among public medical schools by U.S. News and World Report. The College and the University of Iowa Hospitals and Clinics are equal partners in UI Health Care. The hospital is one of the largest university-owned teaching hospitals in the United States, on the Forbes Best Employer list, and is adjacent to the Iowa City Department of Veterans Affairs Medical Center. The Department of Family Medicine has a distinguished teaching, research and clinical faculty. With over 40 primary faculty members, the Department provides clinical services in 5 locations in Eastern Iowa, houses 2 residency and 3 fellowship programs and has established a robust practice-based research network around the state.

The Chair of the Department is the leader of all aspects of the Department's enterprise, serves as the spokesperson for the faculty, and represents the Department in interactions with the College, UI Health Care, and practitioners throughout the state and nationally. Responsibilities include faculty recruitment, appointments, and evaluation; leadership mentoring; educational, clinical and research programs; fiscal planning and management; and short- and long-term strategic planning. Candidates must have a track record of accomplishments permitting the appointment as a tenured Professor of Family Medicine. This includes an MD degree or equivalent, an outstanding record of clinical service and scholarship, eligibility for licensure in Iowa, and certification by the American Board of Family Medicine. The successful candidate will have the demonstrated capacity to foster an environment in which excellence in teaching, research and scholarship flourish, as well as experience in and a commitment to developing and leading clinical, education and research programs.

Candidates must have a record of innovative and effective administrative and fiscal leadership, national stature in academic Family Medicine, excellent interpersonal skills, demonstrated experience promoting a diverse workforce, experience with philanthropy, and positive interactions with students, staff and faculty. The Carver College of Medicine is committed to increasing the diversity of the campus community and to the advancement of inclusive excellence; candidates who can contribute to those goals are encouraged to apply and to outline their strengths or experiences in meeting those goals.

The University of Iowa is located in Iowa City, a vibrant community located in the rolling hills of southeastern Iowa. The community offers excellent schools, quality entertainment, literary, musical and cultural opportunities and Big 10 sporting events. The search committee will accept nominations and applications until the position is filled. Nominations should include a brief statement of the attributes and qualities of the individual that make them a suited for this position and curriculum vitae.
