

# Abstract Submissions FAQ PBRN CONFERENCE

#### What should my submission include?

Oral & Poster Presentations:

- ▲ Title
- Abstract (background, setting & participants, methods, results, and conclusion)
- Research Category
- Learning Objectives (minimum of two required)
- Relevance Statement

#### Workshop:

- Title
- Abstract (rational, audience participation, content to be presented, evaluation method, and prerequisite knowledge)
- Research Category
- Session Description
- Schedule
- Audience
- Learning Objectives (minimum of two required)
- Relevance Statement

## What should my title include?

125 characters including spaces. Do **NOT** use all capitals.

## How many characters should my abstract be?

2,500 characters including spaces. The abstract should be no longer than 2,500 characters in a single paragraph with the following subheads: Background, Settings & Participants, Methods, Results, and Conclusions. Do not include title or author(s).

## What research categories are accepted?

You can find a list of accepted research categories <u>here</u>. You will select your category from a dropdown list when submitting.

#### What is a learning objective?

What you want learners to take away and implement after the session in active, measurable terms (e.g. - define, interpret, explain, apply).

## How long should the learning objective be?

Learning objectives should be no longer than one sentence.

# How many learning objectives do I need to provide?

A minimum of two learning objectives are required for a submission.

#### What is a relevance statement?

Describing the relevance or "take home message" of the session to a patient, community member, or non-researcher in layman's terms.
