PBRN 360: Virginia Ambulatory Care Outcomes Research Network (ACORN) Understanding Primary Care Access: How PBRNs Can Help Primary Care Practices and the Communities They Serve

Even though primary care is the foundation of the healthcare system, there is an inadequate primary care workforce in the US. As a result, many people across many communities do not have a primary care home. At the same time, practices have long wait times making it difficult for clinicians to ensure continuity and access for existing patients. Primary care teams increasingly report high burnout, which is caused partially by increasing care demands. In response, policymakers are taking steps to support and build primary care, launching new payments and policies like the Advanced Primary Care model. In this session, we will review national efforts to build and support the primary care workforce and promote high-quality primary care. We will highlight work from the Virginia Ambulatory Care Outcomes Research Network (ACORN) to identify the primary care workforce, the people and communities receiving high-quality primary care and those with missed care opportunities, and the practicereported challenges with professional turnover and recruitment. We will show how our practice-based research network is trying to guide state policymakers and health systems and provide support for practices and communities to improve care.
