Pre-Conference Workshops

○ PR01: PaCE 101: What are the basic elements of patient and community engaged primary care research

Friday, November 20; 8:00am – 12:00pm

Fee: \$0 (This preconference is open to all. Registration is required.)

Description: This interactive PaCE workshop introduces the foundations of engaged primary care research, highlighting how patients, communities, clinicians, and researchers can work together as equal partners to produce more relevant, person-centered evidence. Through real-world examples, small-group activities, and practical tools, participants will explore strategies for building meaningful research partnerships and identify opportunities to strengthen engagement in their own work.

○ PR02: Designing Digital Health Interventions: A Hands-On Workshop with the Computerized Intervention Authoring System (CIAS)

Friday, November 20; 8:00am - 12:00pm

Fee: \$105 (This preconference is open to all. Registration is required.)

Description: Interested in developing digital health interventions without programming? This hands-on workshop introduces CIAS, a free, open-source no-code platform that enables researchers to design, test, and deploy interactive digital interventions for research and healthcare. Participants will gain practical experience building customizable interventions and leave with the skills to begin creating their own digital health tools.

○ PR03: Keeping engagement evaluation engaging – Picking and using evaluation tools to keep engagement meaningful

Friday, November 20; 1:00pm – 5:00pm

Description: How do we know when research engagement is meaningful? This interactive workshop explores practical tools for evaluating partnerships among patients, communities, clinicians, and researchers, with a focus on maintaining co-ownership, relational equity, and other core principles of engaged research. Through panel discussion and small-group activities, participants will compare evaluation approaches and develop recommendations for selecting and applying engagement measures in primary care research.
